House build

We have numerous teams from Singapore who take part in Tabitha house building. I thought I would share some thoughts from Lisa Newman our Singapore house building coordinator, who herself took a team to Cambodia on the 14th May. The "Singapore Family Build" comprising of 26 kids and 26 adults will build 30 houses

over 2 days. The biggest challenge for this particular build was the logistics. Arranging accommodation, meals, transport etc for a large group can be quite challenging. The majority of people were flying in from Singapore but there are also people flying in from Canada and Australia on different days. When asked what Lisa enjoyed most about it "I am personally really excited about this particular house build as this is the first time I have arranged a build with children. My daughter will experience her first Tabitha House build along with many other children. I just cannot wait to see the faces of our children when the 30 houses are built and they witness the excitement from the Cambodian people when we hand over the houses to them. I truly love to see the interaction between us and the beautiful and very humble people of Cambodia, it's so rewarding and the thought of any hiccups when arranging such a big build disappears immediately. I think once you have been on a house build it becomes addictive and you then begin to think about the next one"
